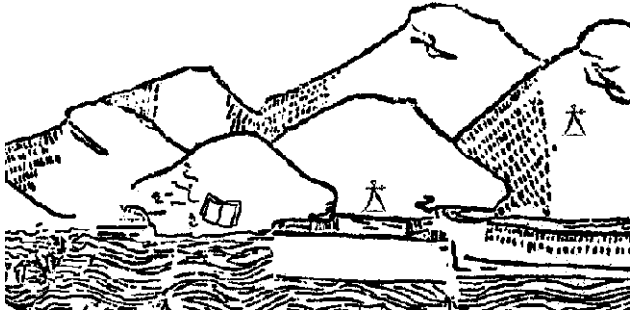


PAPER & BOOK INTENSIVE 2001



Camp Wapiti was established by the Elks Association of Utah to provide outdoor experiences for children with disabilities, and is new and well-maintained. The camp, nestled in a wooded setting, has trails for hiking and biking. It is near the town of Tooele, pronounced Too-wil-ah. Recent historical research reveals that the name "Tooele" comes from the Goshute word, "bear". Now you won't sound foolish when you talk to locals and mention the town's name.

Use the camp address for UPS packages arriving after May 21. We will arrange a UPS pickup for packages leaving the camp on June 1.

Weather: Camp Wapiti is located at an altitude of 6,500 feet. In May, daytime temperatures could range from the mid 50's to the low 70's. Evenings will be much cooler. Rain is not likely but possible. So come prepared for the full range. There are paths between buildings so mud will not be a problem. Bugs will be limited, but you can bring repellent and sun screen for working and hiking outdoors.

Facilities: There are 17 cabins, each built by a different lodge of the Elks Association of Utah. The cabins have bunk beds and electricity. Only a few have heat. You can bring a heating blanket if you wish. No space heaters are allowed. Showers/bathrooms are a short distance from the cabins. They have mirrors with sinks and electrical outlets for hairdryers. There are no laundry facilities in camp for participant use although there is a laundromat in Tooele. Please plan accordingly. Pathways are well lit and easy to walk on, but you may want to bring a small flashlight for evening strolling about.

Please bring or ship UPS ahead:

Pillow, sleeping bag or other warm bedding.

Towel, personal toiletries, poetry.

Optional:

Reading light if needed. Cabins only have overhead lights.

Your favorite travel mug for coffee.

Flashlight, sunglasses, music tapes, water bottle.

Tooele is at the bottom of the hill, a healthy hike or short drive. If you are in need of sundries, liquor, whatever, the town probably has it. Be prepared for a great adventure!
